



Visual Cues

Everyday objects or photographs can be used to help a child understand routine and know what is happening next.

They offer a more permanent reminder than words alone so that if a child is not responding to verbal requests they can get the same cue from the object, photo or symbol.

Use objects/photos/images/symbols to represent everyday activities, routines or places. Show a child the cue immediately before the activity takes place.

Photographs of places or activities can be used to create a timeline or schedule to tell a child what is happening next.
